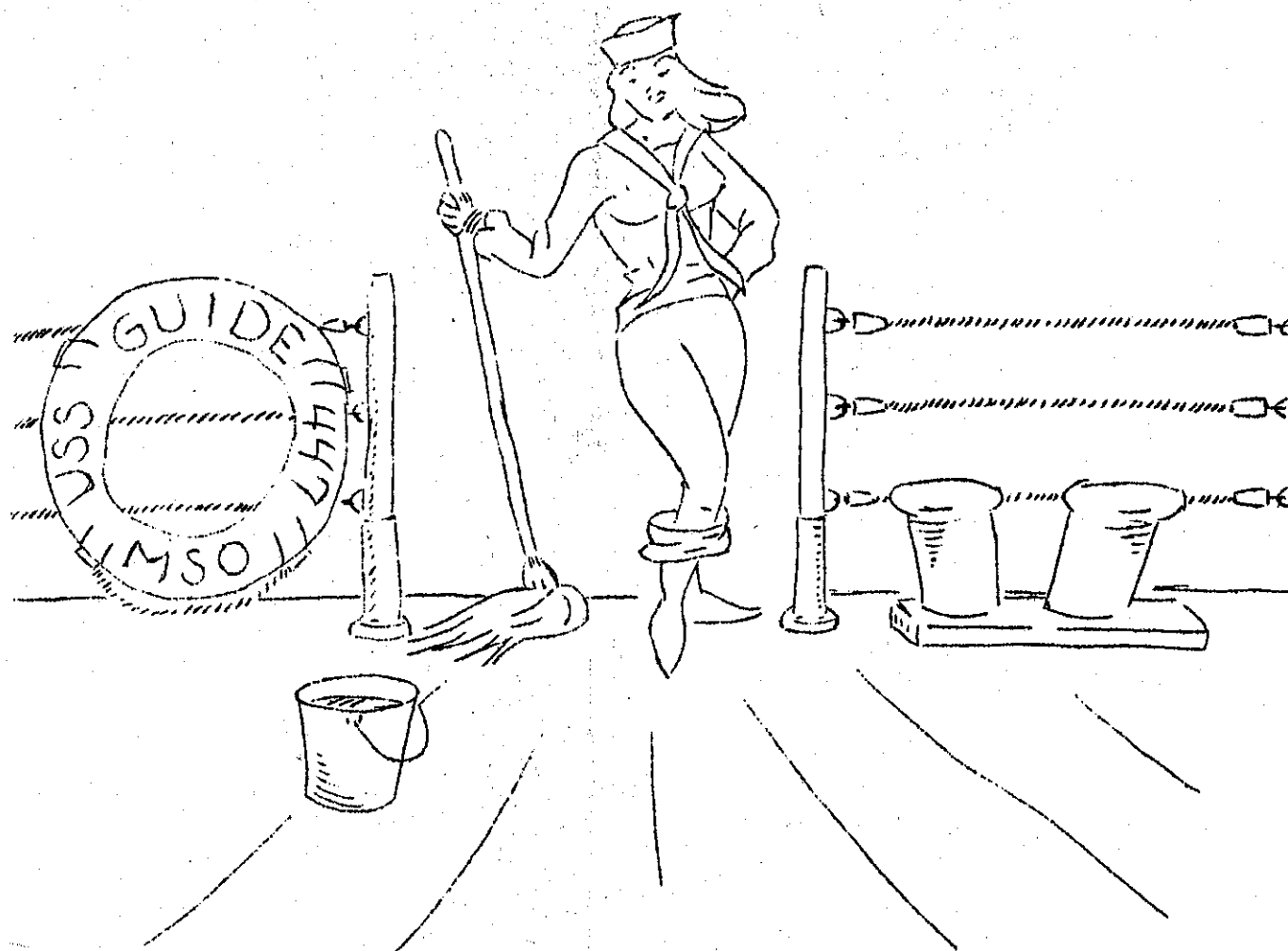

WHAT IS OPERATION MAFGIF??


OPERATION MAFGIF is the cruise of the USS GUIDE on 28 March 1958 in which Male And Female Guests Including Families (Get it?) will be embarked. MAFGIF commences upon the embarkation of guests on 28 March and terminates upon debarkation of guests the same day.

OPERATION MAFGIF

GENERAL SITUATION

OPNAVINST 5720.2A is quoted in part for information:
"Other male and female guests, including families of naval personnel may be authorized passage aboard naval vessels sailing on local cruises of short duration. These cruises shall be during daylight hours only and under favorable weather conditions with due precautions taken for the safety of all guests. No guest under the age of 13 years will be authorized passage". The Commanding Officer requested permission from CNO via the Chain of Command in his letter A4-3, serial 3 of 2 January 1958 to conduct OPERATION MAFGIF. Authority was granted by CNO in his letter serial 115/P21 of 10 February 1958.

GENERAL PREPARATIONS

It is expected that all persons receiving invitations from officers and crew members will be eager to participate in MAFGIF. To gain full benefits and enjoyment the following suggestions are offered:

1. Take early action to obtain baby sitters, if appropriate.
2. Coordinate transportation with other guests or your host.
3. The wearing of slacks and low heeled shoes by female guests is encouraged. Shipboard ladders were not designed for skirts and high heeled shoes.
4. A jacket or other light outer garment will probably be necessary for sea breezes may be a little chilly.
5. If you are a landlubber taking dramamine pills as directed in MEDICAL NOTES is highly recommended.

BOARDING INSTRUCTIONS

The GUIDE will get underway at 0930 (9:30AM). Guests are requested to board at 0830 (8:30 AM) and no later than 0900 (9:00 AM). It is essential that guests board prior to 0900 because a passenger list must be prepared and left ashore prior to getting underway. Guests arriving late will either miss the ship or delay sailing and thereby shorten the cruise.

MEDICAL NOTES

1. Your host will be provided with dramamine (sea sick) tablets. If you have a weakness for motion sickness or suspect that you may possibly suffer from sea sickness it is suggested that you take the tablets according to the following directions.
2. Take one (1) tablet after evening meal the night before the cruise. Take the second tablet at bedtime. Take the final tablet after breakfast before the cruise.
3. An experienced hospitalman will be on board for emergency treatment during the cruise.

PROGRAM

1. The ship will get underway approximately 0930 (9:30 AM) and return to the Naval Station at approximately 1530 (3:30 PM).
2. After clearing the outer breakwater a southeast course will be set for the Hunginton Beach area.
3. Several drills and events are scheduled so that guests may observe the crew in action under varying circumstances. A Plan of the Day for 28 March is included for your information.
4. It is expected that the guests will be given an opportunity to volunteer in assisting in operations such as taking a turn at the helm, taking bearings, acting as lookout, phone talking, log writing, and other duties as may be permitted.

PAPERWORK

Even on this day of fun and frolic a minimum of paper-work will be necessary. Each civilian guest will be required to fill out two forms.

1. Each guest will fill out a form entitled REPORT OF GUESTS EMBARKED.
2. Each civilian guest is required to sign a waiver of release of the Navy from any loss or injury incurred while embarked. This requirement is stipulated in OPNAV Instruction 5720.2A. An additional parents or guardian's agreement is necessary in the case of minor guests.
3. Copies of the above forms are enclosed in the back of this pamphlet and may be filled in advance of arrival on board.

COMFORT FACILITIES

1. The Officer's Head and Washroom aft of the Wardroom will be reserved for female guests during the cruise.
2. Male guests will use the Crew's Head and Washroom located outboard of the mess deck on the port side.
3. The CPO Head and Washroom will be locked and will be reserved for emergency use as directed by the Hospitalman.

0500 - Call duty cook.

0545 - Call duty messmen.

0615 - Call Duty Officer, and Duty Master-at-Arms.

0630 - Reveille.

0645 - Breakfast for the crew.

0710 - Liberty expires for the crew.

0725 - Quarters for muster and inspection, make preparations to get Underway.

0755 - OOD report 0800 to Commanding Officer.

0800 - Colors.

0800 - Shift to Uniform-of-the-day.

0830 - Guests arrive, Guests log in with yeoman at quarterdeck and submit GUEST report and Waiver of Responsibility Certificate.

0900 - Yeoman deliver GUEST REPORT ashore. Station all special sea and anchor details. OOD obtain permission to get Underway.

0930 - Underway enroute operating area.

1000 - Set regular sea watch.

1030 - Conduct tactics with USS EXCEL and USS ENHANCE.

1100 - Commence "CHUCK MAGN" Dinner.

1155 - OOD report 1200 to Commanding Officer.

1300 - Minesweeping detail man your stations, Stream double "O" type gear.

1400 - Recover all gear.

1400 - Hold man-overboard drill, Guests observe from quarterdeck area.

1430 - Hold light line transfer exercise with USS EXCEL and USS ENHANCE, Guests observe from O2 level forward.

1500 - Enter port, Station all special sea and anchor details.

1530 - Moor Pipeline Pier, Naval Station, Long Beach. Liberty commences (72) for section 3 expires 31 MAR 58. For section 2 expires 0730 29 MAR 58.

1545 - OOD make security inspection of ship.

1600 - Check setting of Material Condition "Y", (Modified).

1630 - Supper for the crew.

1940 - Night 0'clock reports.

1955 - OOD report 2000 to Commanding Officer.


2000 - Movie.

2145 - Sweep down messdeck and berthing compartments.

2200 - Taps, out all lights.

2. FOR GUESTS - Your host has been advised of the schedule of events and will advise you of the best location for observing events as they occur.
3. The ship will get underway Monday 31 March 1958 for local operations.
